## Faculty of Law

- Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected. The Faculty may consider students' professional experience as well as the balance of exchange with partner universities for selection.
- Bachelor's degree students must choose their courses from the [list of courses open to exchange students](#).
- Proof of English proficiency is required for the Master in Business Law and the Master in Comparative Common Law. Students must have an IELTS of 6.5 or a TOEFL (MyBest Scores accepted) of 90.

<b>Closed programs</b>	<p><b>Urban Planning :</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Minor program</li></ul> <p><b>Landscape Architecture :</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Minor in Garden and Landscape Design</li></ul> <p><b>Design :</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Master programs</li></ul>
<b>School of Architecture</b>	<p>The School of Architecture negotiates in advance with its partners the number of students who can submit applications. Only students from universities that are partners with the School of Architecture can apply (university-wide agreements are not accepted).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Only applications for the full academic year (September to April) can be accepted.</li><li>• Prospective candidates must provide a portfolio.</li><li>• The School accepts a limited number of students pursuing a Bachelor's degree of Architecture who would like to apply for their third year.</li><li>• If the agreement allows Master level exchanges, students must have completed at least 4 years of studies at their home university. The number of places at the Master level is very limited.</li></ul>
<b>School of Design</b>	<p>The School negotiates in advance with its partners the number of students who can submit applications. Only students from universities that are partners with the School of Design can apply (university-wide agreements are not accepted).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Interior Design and Industrial Design programs are open in the fall term only.</li><li>• Applications must include a portfolio. Only PDF portfolios sent to <a href="mailto:exchange@umontreal.ca">exchange@umontreal.ca</a> by WeTransfer are accepted.</li><li>• No late applications will be accepted after the deadline: April 1.</li><li>• A B1 level of French is accepted for Industrial Design students only.</li></ul>

<b>School of Urban Planning and Landscape Architecture</b>	<p>The School negotiates in advance with its partners the number of students who can submit applications. Only students from universities that are partners with the School of Urban Planning and Landscape Architecture can apply (university-wide agreements are not accepted).</p> <p><b>Urban Planning :</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bachelor level workshop courses are closed to exchange students.</li> <li>• Students can only apply for one term (there might have exceptions).</li> <li>• Master level students must have completed at least one semester of their Master's program before beginning the exchange.</li> <li>• Only a limited number of students are accepted for the Master in Urban Planning, with limited access to workshop courses.</li> </ul> <p><b>Landscape Architecture :</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Master level students must have completed at least one semester of their Master's program before beginning the exchange.</li> <li>• Master level students must enroll to a minimum of 9 credits per term.</li> <li>• The School of Urban Planning and Landscape Architecture accepts students applying to the Master's degree for one term only.</li> <li>• Students must send a portfolio in PDF via WeTransfer to <a href="mailto:echange@umontreal.ca">echange@umontreal.ca</a>.</li> </ul>

<b>Closed programs</b>	<p>The <b>Department of Communication</b> does not accept exchange students (excluding students from universities with which the department has signed a specific agreement).</p> <p><b>Master's degree (DESS) – Media, Culture and Technology</b></p> <p><b>Master's degree (DESS) – Journalism</b></p> <p><b>Master's degree (DESS) - Arts, Creation and Technology</b></p> <p><b>Master's degree (DESS) – Digital Editing</b></p> <p><b>Master's degree (DESS) – Social Administration</b></p> <p><b>Bachelor's degree – Political Sciences and Philosophy</b></p> <p><b>Bachelor's degree – Literature and Human Sciences</b></p> <p><b>Master's degree – Physics – Plasma Option, international path</b></p> <p><b>Master's degree – Medical Physics</b></p>
<b>Minor in Arts and Sciences</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students can choose up to 2 courses from the same program of study per term.</li> <li>• 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year (2xxx and 3xxx) course registration cannot be guaranteed, since there are often prerequisites for the courses. It is therefore important to select courses according to their requirements; the evaluation of an application may take longer if 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> year courses are selected.</li> </ul>

Department of Political Science	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students whose first language is not French must submit a proof of French proficiency according to the Common European Framework that includes their level of written and speaking French.</li> <li>Students must choose at least 2 Political Science courses per term.</li> <li><b>Bachelor in International Studies:</b> students should choose up to 1 Law course per term.</li> <li><b>Bachelor in Communication and Politics:</b> students should choose up to 2 Communication courses per term.</li> <li><b>Bachelor in Economics and Politics:</b> students should choose up to 2 Political Science courses per term.</li> </ul>
Master programs in International Studies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students whose first language is not French, must submit a proof of French proficiency according to the Common European Framework that includes their level of written and oral French.</li> <li>Students should choose up to 1 Political Science course and up to 1 Law course per term.</li> <li>Students must have a background in Political Science or Social Sciences.</li> <li>Students must have a good knowledge of English (reading and written).</li> </ul>
Department of Communication	<p>The Department negotiates in advance with its partners the number of students who can submit applications. Only students from universities that are partners with the Department of Communication can apply (university-wide agreements are not accepted).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Only the Bachelor and the Master in Communication Sciences are open to exchange students.</li> <li>The number of places in the Master in Communication is very limited and a good level of English is required.</li> </ul>
Department of Demography	<p>Only students currently enrolled in a Bachelor at their home university can apply to the Bachelor in Demography.</p>
Department of Art History and Film Studies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Exchange students cannot take practical courses from the Bachelor in Film Studies (117110). Undergraduate candidates only have access to courses offered within the Film Studies Minor (117140) or the Major (117120).</li> <li>Graduate students do not have access to seminars CIN6053A, CIN6054A, CIN7001A and HAR60011-60012; they are reserved for regular students of the Department of Art History and Film Studies.</li> <li>Please note that only a one-term exchange is possible for the Master and PhD in Film studies.</li> <li>Students whose first language is not French must provide a proof of French proficiency corresponding to level B2 of the Common European Framework, or its equivalent, with a writing and speaking level of at least 15/25.</li> </ul>
Department of Biology	<p>Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected. The Department may restrict access to several courses if places are limited.</p>

<b>Department of Linguistics and Translation</b>	<p>Students whose first language is not French must provide a TFI of 785/990 or a DALF or TEF of C1 for these programs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bachelor in Translation (118510)</li> <li>• Major in Translation (118520)</li> <li>• Bachelor in Linguistics (118101)</li> <li>• Major in Linguistics (118020)</li> <li>• Bachelor in French Literature and Linguistics (114715)</li> <li>• Master in Linguistics (218010)</li> <li>• PhD in Linguistics (318010)</li> </ul> <p>Students whose first language is not French must provide a DALF or TEF of C2 and have an advanced level of English for these programs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• DESS (master level degree) in Translation (218512)</li> <li>• Professional Master in Translation (218511)</li> </ul> <p>Students whose first language is not French must provide a DALF or TEF of C1 and have an advanced level of English for these programs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Research Master in Translation (218511)</li> <li>• PhD in Translation (318510)</li> <li>• Bachelor in French Literature and Linguistics (114715): students must choose at least 2 Linguistics courses per term.</li> </ul>
<b>Department of French Language Literatures</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Undergraduate programs: students whose first language is not French must provide a proof of French proficiency of C1</li> <li>• Graduate programs: students whose first language is not French must provide a proof of French proficiency of C2</li> </ul>
<b>Department de Psychology</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected.</li> <li>• The Department of Psychology accepts only a limited number of students for the Master and PhD.</li> <li>• The following courses are closed to exchange students: NCM2200, PSY1048, PSY1049, PSY2007, PSY2008, PSY2038, PSY3008, PSY3018, PSY3129, PSY3298, PSY3299, PSY4016, PSY40001 and PSY40002.</li> <li>• Several mandatory books must be read in English. Mastering this language is necessary to study in this Department.</li> <li>• Internship and research options are not available for exchange students.</li> </ul>
<b>Department of Literatures and Languages of the World – English Studies</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students whose first language is not English must provide proof of English proficiency. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- B1.2 is required for the Major and Minor in English Studies.</li> <li>- B2 is required for the Bachelor in English Studies.</li> <li>- All types of language certificates are accepted; for example, a letter from home university, <a href="#">English level test of the British Council</a>, etc.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Students who are currently taking courses in English Studies at their home university will be prioritised in the selection process.</li> <li>• Upon arrival, students must take an English placement test and may be asked to take an English language course depending on placement result.</li> </ul>

<b>Department of Economics</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected.</li> <li>• Students whose first language is not French must provide proof of French proficiency according to the Common European Framework, a C1 or its equivalent is required. Level of written and speaking French must be provided.</li> <li>• Students must choose at least 3 Economics courses per term.</li> <li>• Students can choose up to 1 language course per term.</li> </ul>
<b>School of Psychoeducation : Bachelor and Master in Psychoeducation</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected.</li> <li>• Internships are not offered.</li> <li>• For Master level courses, students with an undergraduate level degree in the field of Psychology or Criminology will be prioritised.</li> <li>• Complete applications for the Master program must be received before February 1.</li> </ul>
<b>School of Criminology</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The School of Criminology does not accept exchange students for internships and imposes several restrictions for exchange students. Please refer to <a href="#">this document</a> (in French only) for more information.</li> <li>• Students can only apply for one term for the Bachelor program.</li> <li>• Internship option not available to exchange students.</li> <li>• Students must indicate in their letter of intent: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Their overall average</li> <li>- Level of study when on exchange at UdeM.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>School of Industrial Relations</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Only students with a background in a relevant field of study (Management, Labour and Management Studies, Law, Political Science, etc.) will be considered.</li> <li>• Only students with an overall average of 12/20 (or its equivalent) and higher will be considered.</li> <li>• Students who wish to take undergraduate courses with prerequisites must first obtain the approval of the Academic Advisor.</li> <li>• One or two Master degree courses can be taken only under the Academic Advisor's recommendation.</li> <li>• Candidates whose first language is not French must provide proof of French proficiency corresponding to level C1 of the Common European Framework, or its equivalent.</li> <li>• PhD programs are closed to exchange students, except the research-credit students.</li> </ul>
<b>School of Social Work</b>	<p>Students from universities that have a specific agreement directly with the School of Social Work will be prioritised. Other applications will be evaluated according to available places.</p>
<b>Department of Chemistry</b>	<p>Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only students with an overall average above 12/20 (or its equivalent) will be considered.</p>

<b>Master in Museology</b>	<p>These courses are not opened to exchanges students:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- MSL6600 Internship</li> <li>- MSL6800 Overview Seminar</li> <li>- MSL6700 Working Group (led by a professor)</li> </ul> <p><i>This restriction does not apply to students from École du Louvre.</i></p>

<b>Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students in their 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> year : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Only students from universities that are partners with the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine can apply (university-wide agreements are not accepted).</li> <li>- Students can only take 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year courses.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Students in their last year of studies (clinical training) : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Students can only apply for one term (fall or winter).</li> <li>- The Faculty only accepts a maximum of 10 students per term.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>Master and PhD Programs</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Graduate students in research oriented programs : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Students must obtain the approval of a professor from the Faculty before applying.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Faculty of Education	
<b>Closed program</b>	Master's degree in <b>Education- Secondary Teaching (281113)</b> is closed to exchange students.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Undergraduate students must have completed at least one year of bachelor studies at their home university before beginning the exchange.</li> <li>The number of places is very limited in the Bachelor in Physical and Health Education.</li> <li>Students whose first language is not French must provide a TFI (International French test) with a score of 785/990.</li> <li>Internship option not available.</li> <li>Deadline to submit an application for the winter term: June 1<sup>st</sup></li> </ul>

	The <b>Doctorate of Optometry Degree (OD)</b> is closed to exchange students.

Faculty of Medicine	
<b>Closed Programs</b>	<p><b>The Medical Doctor Program (MD) is closed to exchange students.</b></p> <p>The Faculty of Medicine accepts to receive a limited number of exchange applications at the preparatory year (clerkship) for the program leading to the achievement of a medical degree: <a href="http://medecine.umontreal.ca/etudes/doctorat-en-medecine/etudiants-visiteurs/">http://medecine.umontreal.ca/etudes/doctorat-en-medecine/etudiants-visiteurs/</a>.</p> <p><b>Master's degree - Cellular Biology and Pathology</b>  <b>Bachelor and Master programs in Audiology</b>  <b>Bachelor's degree – Biomedical Sciences</b>  <b>Master in Language Pathology and the Master in Audiology</b>  <b>Bachelor in Language Pathology and the Bachelor in Audiology</b> are no longer offered.</p>

<b>School of Kinesiology and Physical Activity Studies</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected.</li> <li>• Students whose first language is not French must provide proof of French proficiency corresponding to C1 according to the Common European Framework, or its equivalent.</li> <li>• Undergraduate and Master level students must have completed at least the first year of their degree in order to be considered.</li> <li>• Internship options are not available.</li> </ul>
<b>Department of Nutrition</b>	<p><b>Bachelor in Nutrition :</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The number of places is limited, only applicants with an above-average academic record will be considered.</li> <li>• Students whose first language is not French must provide the TFI (International French Test) with a score of 850/990.</li> <li>• Undergraduate students must have completed at least the first year of their degree and can only take bachelor level courses.</li> <li>• Internship option not available.</li> </ul>
<b>School of Rehabilitation</b>	<p><b>For the Bachelor in Health Sciences (Occupational Therapy) and the Master in Occupational Therapy :</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The number of places in exchange program is limited, only applicants with an above-average academic record will be considered.</li> <li>• Students whose first language is not French must provide the TFI (International French Test) with a score of 785/990.</li> <li>• Undergraduate students must have completed at least 2 years of their degree before beginning the exchange.</li> <li>• Students may be asked to take preliminary online courses before the beginning of the exchange</li> <li>• <u>For clinical training options</u>: only students from universities that are partners with the School can apply (university-wide agreements are not accepted).</li> </ul>

## Faculty of Nursing

- Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be considered.
- Undergraduate students can take only one of the following 3<sup>rd</sup> year courses: SOI3604A/3604B/3704 or SOI3516/3716.
- Candidates whose first language is not French must provide the TFI (International French Test) with a score of 785/990 and a score of 4 for the writing component.
